

Pupil Premium at Stanbridge Primary

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools in an effort to address inequalities between children from low-income families and their peers. The premium was introduced in 2011-2012 and was originally set at £488.00 per eligible pupil but this was later increased to £600.00 per eligible pupil.

There are three categories of pupils that are eligible:

- Children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM);
- Looked After Children
- Children of Armed Forces Personnel

From September 2012 schools are required to publish information about how they have spent the pupil premium during the previous year and strategies planned for the forthcoming year.

In 2011-2012 13% of pupils were eligible for free school meals; we have no looked after children and no children of families from armed forces personnel. The total allocation of Pupil Premium to Stanbridge Primary School during 2011-2012 was £25,088

The Premium allocation was spent on:

- Intervention activities for specific learning needs
- Booster Classes
- Play Ranger
- 1:1 support

2012-2013

During 2012-2013 our allocation is £40,485 the school plans to use the premium to continue with the above. We have had an increase in the number of children with Free School Meals from September 2012 and our allocation will reflect this increase.
