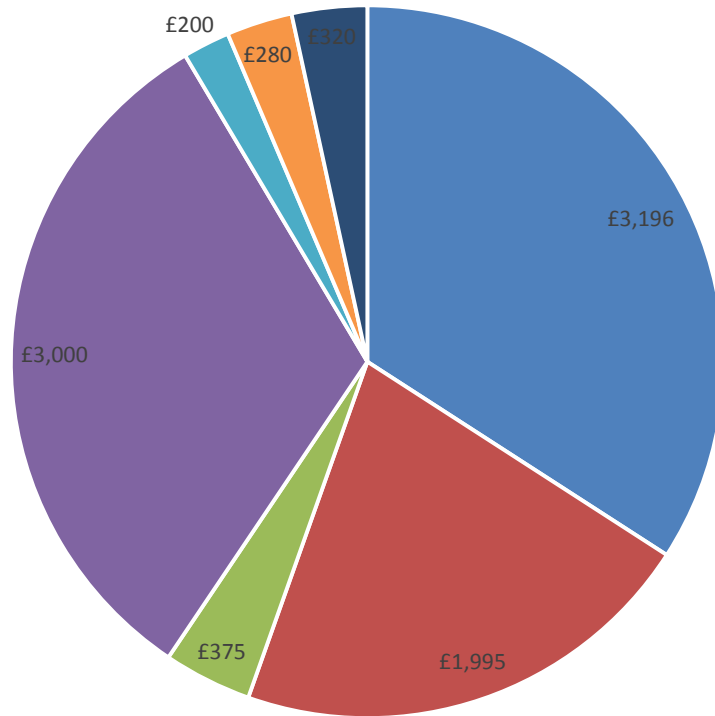

What worked well?

The schools analysis and attainment data at the end of April 2014 indicated that:

Grange Sports Partnership	£3,196	<p>Children are given a wide range of opportunities to take part in level 1 and 2 sports competitions.</p> <p>Staff are given a range of opportunities to receive professional development from orienteering to football.</p> <p>Sports crew have opportunities to train and be coached to be a sports leader as part of the school mark games awards.</p>	<p>Children from years 2 to 6 have competed in a variety of sports through the grange sports partnership, such as gymnastics, tennis, golf and archery with great pride. The gymnastics team reached the level 3 stage of the competition and had the opportunity to compete at the University of Bath as a result.</p>
New PE scheme of work	£1,995	<p>All children will follow the new Real PE SoW which allows children to develop the three core skills of balance, agility and co-ordination. The scheme allows teachers to follow a set scheme but also has flexibility in the lessons for teachers to make it their own.</p> <p>This will demonstrate progression throughout the school for every child and allow for monitoring and assessment.</p> <p>This is new, so the impact is yet to be seen. However, all teachers have praised the scheme so far and have expressed how much they have enjoyed teaching it.</p>	<p>A new monitoring and assessment strategy is being trialled by the school's sports coach in PE lessons/master classes across all year groups. The children will use self-assessment wheels to show progression throughout their time at Stanbridge.</p> <p>Staff received training on INSET day on how to deliver the new real PE scheme of work and as a result, feel more confident delivering it.</p> <p>New class teachers and team teachers will be receiving training from the school's sports coach on how to deliver the scheme. They will have the opportunity to observe the sports coach delivering Real PE lessons and team teach them with him.</p>
Shed for PE/Playtime storage	£375	<p>More storage has resulted in the PE cupboard tidier and free of clutter, which was becoming a health and safety issue. As well as this, teachers and sports coaches</p>	<p>The new shed is being used to store all outdoor PE equipment, with all the indoor equipment stored in the gym cupboards. As a result, it's made it easier for teachers and</p>

Play Leader – playtime/lunchtime	£3,000	Children always have an adult option to play during playtimes/lunchtimes. The play leader has trained play buddies to facilitate activities led by the buddies.	Having the play leaders has given children a recognisable focal point to go to, to be able to play with others. Consequently, no children are left on their own with no one to play with. It has also allowed children to play new, structured games and provided more of a purpose to play times.
Basketball posts	£200	Unfortunately, one of the basketball posts has been broken due to the bad winds. Children use this for basketball club and some year groups get to use these at play times.	New basketball posts have been purchased. Some of the new posts have a bigger target and are at a lower height, making them suitable for the younger children. These posts will be used during lunch times and at after school clubs run by the sports coach.
Netball lines	£280	The netball lines have enabled children to enjoy training and host games against other teams with pride. They are also being used by classes who are doing their daily running.	A netball club is set to be run for key stage 2 this coming year. Key stage 1 still use these lines to do daily runs on. The lines on one of the courts have faded quite significantly, so may need re-spraying.
New sports kits	£320	The new kit has enabled children to enter tournaments and events with real pride to be representing their school. It is multi-purpose so can be worn for all non-grass based competitions.	The new kits have been used for various events such as Olympiad, tennis and hockey. As a result, children have been able to represent the school with pride and look very presentable.
Masterclasses – curriculum enrichment (dance, tennis, badminton)	£4680 (mainly funded through main budget)	The sports coaches have commented how much children have improved at specific sports during the year. They feel they can really target the children because of the size of the groups.	Children across all year groups have taken part in badminton, golf and tennis masterclasses through the schools sport coaches. Due to the smaller group sizes, children have progressed very well and winning the year 3/4 tennis
