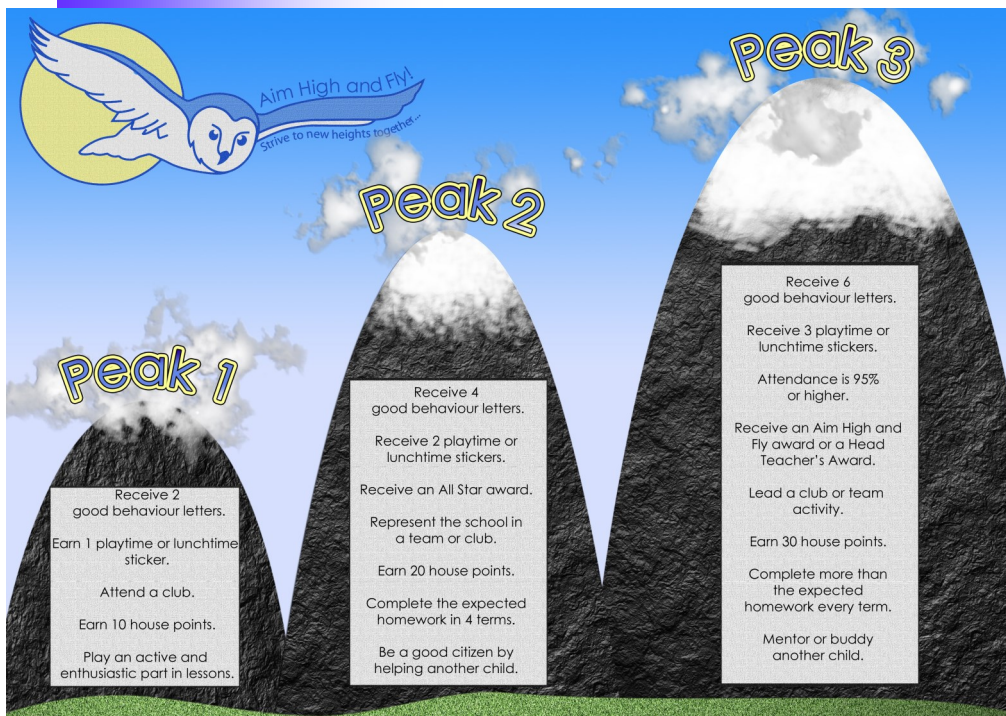

Class 6B Golden Rules a September

Everyone has the right to feel happy and safe.

- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- Be supportive and responsible towards others.
- Ensure everyone feels welcome and included.
- Treat other people's belongings with care and respect.
- If you can't say anything nice say nothing at all.

How is good behaviour rewarded?

- ⇒ Class Rewards e.g. team points, stickers, stamps, additional responsibilities.
- ⇒ Verbal praise and marking feedback in books.
- ⇒ House Points which contribute to whole school house point system and termly cup.
- ⇒ Stanbridge All Star- certificate awarded each week to a child in each class for working hard and behaving well
- ⇒ Aim High and Fly certificate awarded in assembly for those children doing 'above and beyond'- producing their very best work.
- ⇒ Head Teacher award nominated by staff once a term. Infant and Junior Cup given to the child who has a really positive attitude to school life. Other nominated pupils will receive a certificate.
- ⇒ If the child's name does not appear in the incident book for a term a good behaviour letter will be sent home and the children will receive a certificate.
- ⇒ 3 Peaks Behaviour Challenge - children can work towards each peak to gain certificates.

What happens if children break the rules?

Stage 1

- Verbal warning given by the class teacher. A reminder of expectations and class charter.
- In class strategies for support e.g time out – in class

Stage 2 – Amber

- Official warning – name recorded on Amber spot Reception and KS1) or in Stage 2 book (KS2)
- Additional strategies to support including time out in partner class

Stage 3 - Red

- Child must report to Head Teacher at playtime or lunchtime. Every effort is made to ensure a child does not miss learning time.
- Miss a break time and name is recorded in the Stage 3 incident book.
- If the child's name is recorded in the incident book 4 or more times in a term then a letter of concern will be sent home. Parents will be invited into meet with Head Teacher and/or the class teacher. An individual action plan will be devised to encourage good behaviour.
- A separate serious behaviour policy is in place for those children who misbehave seriously and/or consistently. We endeavour to work closely with parents/carers to bring about a positive change in behaviour.

nd Class Charter 2016

Everyone has the right to work without distractions.

- Move around the school quietly and sensibly.
- Don't mess around in lessons.
- Only talk in lessons when it is about the learning.
- Don't interrupt others when they are sharing their learning or ideas.
